

## University of Hawai'i Roles in Lamakū

Role	Use Case
<b>Administrator</b>	Help Desk
<b>Advisor</b>	This role allows specific individuals (like academic advisors or counselors) to view a student's progress and grades within a course without the ability to edit content or make changes. The instructor adds this role to the course
<b>COIL Instructor</b>	An instructor from a visiting international university in a course, using Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) modules The instructor adds this role to the course.
<b>Demo Student</b>	Instructors and content editors (designers, TAs) can enroll a demo student to have the flexibility to mimic (impersonate) the student role for development purposes.
<b>Designer</b>	Course partners who need access to course setup and design or curriculum development. (i.e. instructional designer). Cannot access student data in active courses (i.e. attendance, assignment submissions, quiz submissions, grades). The instructor adds this role to the course.
<b>Facilitator</b>	Assigned to non-academic course managers, such as those facilitating professional development courses or resource sites.
<b>Guest</b>	Used for notetaker, observer, or guest speaker. Read-only access. No access to student data (i.e. attendance, grades, assignments submissions, quiz submissions).
<b>Incomplete</b>	A student enrolled in an inactive course to fulfill the requirements of an incomplete grade. The instructor on record would request the LMS Admin team to enroll the student in an incomplete role into an inactive course.
<b>Instructor</b>	Assigned by default to the instructor of record for a course offering.
<b>Instructor-Content Copy Only</b>	Instructor-Content Copy Only is a view-only role of course content and activities. It provides the ability to copy content from one Lamakū site to another. The Instructor or Facilitator roles can add this role.
<b>Lab Coordinator</b>	Lab coordinators are enrolled in the course offering or section by the instructor. Similar permissions as the instructor with the ability to edit announcements, content, assignments, quizzes, and grades.

<b>Librarian</b>	Librarians at the college or university level. Can see and interact with course content, assignments, and announcements without access to student data (i.e. attendance, grades, assignments submissions, quiz submissions). The instructor adds this role to the course.
<b>Non-registered learner</b>	This role is assigned to students who are not enrolled as registered students (i.e., senior visitors/kūpuna, etc.). This role has similar permissions as a student. However, non-registered learners cannot receive a final grade via MyGrades. The instructor can add this role to the course.
<b>Participant</b>	This role is assigned to learners enrolled in non-credit courses, professional development, orientations, or training sites. The facilitator and instructor role can add participant users.
<b>Reviewer</b>	This role allows a reviewer to see course content and how the course is set up. "Read-only" cannot see student data (e.g., attendance, grades, assignment submissions, and quiz submissions). The instructor adds this role to the course.
<b>Student</b>	Student role is restricted to participating in current term course offerings in which the Registrar's Office enrolls them via Banner. The role cannot be assigned by the instructor.
<b>System Administrator</b>	LMS administrators
<b>Teaching Assistant</b>	TAs who are actively involved in creating the course or course materials and/or grading. The instructor adds this role to the course.
<b>Teaching Assistant - Grade Only</b>	TAs who are only responsible for grading assignments, discussions, or quizzes as assigned by the Instructor. The instructor adds this role to the course.
<b>Tutor</b>	The instructor enrolls the tutor role to assist students in the course without access to student data (i.e. attendance, assignment submissions, quiz submissions, grades). The instructor adds this role to the course.
